Promotions and Support Assignments

With the start of the FY 2022 budget on October 1, MFR is authorized for 3 new full-time firefighter positions. This will allow for 5 persons (LT, DO and 3 FFs) on each shift. We will be adjusting our staffing policy to take this new staffing level into consideration. The primary advantage for the 5th person on each shift is it should reduce our reliance on PT staffing and the occasions when we operate with 3 personnel. Moving forward, we will continue to pay PT or FT personnel to maintain 4-person staffing on the engine, but will not hire additional staffing when staffing drops from 5 to 4 personnel.

The following part-time personnel have been offered positions as full-time firefighters and they have accepted.

There have also been some adjustments to our Logistics and Training roles in the organization. We are excited to be bringing on Ben Liner as our Training Unit Leader. He will be working on building out training programs ranging from company drills to certification classes. He will also be the POC for scheduling members to attend outside training courses and conferences. He will be meeting with the officers at our October 18th officer meeting to discuss topics and the direction of training at MFR. An early priority for the organization will be conducting a DO class for any full-time firefighters that are not currently certified.

Stefanie Serrano will be taking on the lead role as Medical Manager in Logistics as well as Medical Unit Leader under the training program. She will be maintaining supply, inventory, and maintenance of our medical equipment as well as developing training in support of our medical mission.

Eric Pena has assumed the role of Apparatus Maintenance Manager and will oversee the repair needs of the fleet and coordination with our vendors. He will also be assisting Vincent Reed as needed in the maintenance and acquisition of our tools and small engine equipment.
